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About Bal Sahyog



Bal Sahyog was founded as a pious endeavor by the late Prime Minister of India, Smt. Indira Gandhi in 1954 for Care and Protection of the helpless, orphan, abandoned, runaways and vulnerable children and the children rescued from child labour. Bal Sahyog provides round-the-clock services of shelter, nutrition, medical care, clothing, education, vocational training, recreational and overall amenities to more than 125 children within its Children's Home. The Hon'ble Prime Minister of India is the Patron of Bal Sahyog.

In its endeavor to the holistic development of children in need and collective action, Bal Sahyog has been networking and collaborating with different Child Care Institutions, Government Institutions, Law Enforcement Agencies, Donor Agencies, Non-Government Organizations, Civil Society Organizations, Opinion Makers, and individuals for the same. It is located in the area of 1.67 acres in Connaught Place, New Delhi. It has also established a Bal Sahyog Middle School within its campus that is aided by Govt. of NCT of Delhi.

The Organization has a well-defined financial policy, Child Protection Policy, HR Policy, and its accounts are audited by a reputed audit firm. Bal Sahyog works only in the NCT of Delhi.

To address this gap, Bal Sahyog intervenes in working for the rights and dignity of these underprivileged children in need of care and protection, by not only providing shelter, but also by laying the foundation for a child's future health,

learning and behavior through nurturing, mentoring and providing quality education. There is no question in my mind that investing in quality education and care programs are essential to build the skills, assets and competencies of children so that they succeed and become productive amidst challenging circumstances. My sincere gratitude to individual volunteers, stakeholders, donors, corporate partners who have joined hands with Bal Sahyog in its mission to help realize the potentials of the children.

I also highly appreciate Mr. Sandeep for his efforts in creating this annual report.

VISION

To actualize the birthright of every child to a safe and secure childhood so that s/he can develop the intellectual, practical, and spiritual capabilities to live a meaningful adult life and contribute to nation-building.

MISSION

To provide opportunities that help economically and socially marginalized children to develop their full potential in an atmosphere of love, understanding, and joyful learning.

GOVERNANCE

Bal Sahyog is governed by a General Committee of 25–30 members nominated by the Prime Minister's Office. These members are eminent people from different fields including current and retired bureaucrats, academicians, and social workers.

Mrs. Reva Nayyar, retired IAS (Former Secretary to the Ministry of Women & Child Development, Government of India), is the Chairperson of the General Committee. The General Committee, being the governing body, decides the overall policy of the organization. For day to day function and implementing the policies of the General Committee, an Executive Committee is constituted. The Executive Committee is headed by the Chairperson of the General Committee. It has four members elected/selected by the General Committee and an Executive Director who also acts as the Ex-officio Member-Secretary of the General Committee and the Executive Committee.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Bal Sahyog is financially supported by grants from the Government of the National Capital Territory (NCT) of Delhi, the Tech Mahindra Foundation, as well as several individuals and corporate donors, to support various welfare activities for underprivileged children, women, and youth. Besides, several individuals, groups, institutions, and NGOs donate materials in kind like play materials, dresses, shoes, rations, etc. for children, and also participate in fun activities, creative programmes, and celebrate important occasions and sponsor lunches and dinners for children. Some patrons sponsor exposure visits for children to historical places, gardens, and parks in Delhi.



Operational Area

The Children's Home is located in Central Delhi (which also houses its head office) at Connaught Place, and its outreach programmes are organised in Central Delhi, including the areas of New Delhi Railway Station, Bengali Market, Hanuman Mandir, Paharganj, Shankar Market, and Bangla Sahib Gurudwara, etc. It has been making constant efforts to strengthen its institutional approach to reach out to the community so that prevention and sustainable assistance for the growth and development of children can be provided through community awareness. Last year, Bal Sahyog had community development points (community contact centres) located in different slums of Delhi, such as Wazirpur in North-West Delhi, Karol Bagh, and Connaught Place in Central Delhi.

Achievements At Bal Sahyog

Stay

248 boys stayed at Bal Sahyog, among which 112 were in the Open Shelter.

Mainstream

82 children were mainstreamed into education.

Restore

14 children from the Children Home and 94 children from Open Shelter were either restored to their families or transferred to other institutions.

Sponsorship

104 children from class 1 to class 12 were supported for quality education under the Scholarship Programme of the 'Tech Mahindra Foundation'.

Vocational Training

300 youths were vocationally trained in computer courses. This Vocational training was supported by Tech Mahindra Foundation.

Special Meals

143 meals for boys were made special for the children by our generous supporters.



Infrastructure

Children Home

We have five dormitories each containing bunker beds for 20 children, one bed for each with appropriate lighting, coolers, fans and ventilation and personal locker or rack to store their daily use material materials.

Dispensary

We have a medical dispensary room holding capacity of eight beds and a room for the doctor containing all necessary equipment for the doctor.

Open Shelter

We provide residential facilities to 25 children who need care and protection for short period. We have Two dormitories, one entertainment cum-activity room, and one large veranda for these children

Play Ground

We have a playground having sufficient space for the children to play outdoor games like cricket, football etc. the Playground also contains various open gym equipments.

Middle School

We run an aided school under DTE, Govt of Delhi, NCT from class VI to Class VIII.

Kitchen

The well-equipped modular kitchen containing refrigerators Dough Kneading Machine ,roti making machine etc. for better and faster service.

Computer Room

We have two computer labs consisting of total 24 computer systems where children from Bal Sahyog and near by communities come to take computer education.

Dining Hall

A large dining hall with enough capacity for all 125 children to dine together.

Conference room

In the conference room we have sitting capacity of total 55 children. where the children and staff gather for meetings or to attend seminars or farewell or workshop.

Physical Training Room

Children practice physical activities like dance and drama at the PT room. It has enough capacity for a group of 15 children to practice the act.



Facilities We Offer

Residence

Licensed housing facility for 125 children as per the Juvenile Justice Act. Managed by qualified and professional staff. One House Parent per 20 boys to care, support, guide and track their progress

Vocational Training

We have computer training centre at Wazirpur, Karol Bagh and Connaught place where children from nearby locality and from Bal Sahyog come to learn computer.

Education

Children from class VI to VIII study at Bal Sahyog Middle School and from IX to XII at nearby schools. Children received tuitions through sponsorship program by the Tech Mahindra Foundation

Counseling

Bal Sahyog has 3 well qualified counselors who help children resolve and improve their mental health if required.

Dining

Four cooks are engaged to prepare, fresh & hot meals which are provided to children according to a comprehensive menu for each day ensuring adequate and appropriate nutrition contents

Travel and Exposure Visit

Children go for exposure visit and travel nearby places, for which we have a bus with capacity of 40 seats and a van with capacity of 7 seats.

Entertainment

Children enjoy watching television or listening to music according to the routine set for them to follow.

Medical

First aid and over-the-counter medicines for general ailments are always available to meet all emergency medical needs at the dispensary. We have an experienced male nurse to take care of all medical needs.

Sports

Children play outdoor games like cricket, football etc. in the playground. Children also enjoy indoor games like Chess, Ludo, Lego, and other board games in their leisure time.

Collaboration

At Bal Sahyog we conduct camps and meetings in collaboration with different NGO's corporates, hospitals, schools etc. for the children.

Open Gym

To keep children healthy mentally and physically we have an open gym in the playground area where children practice different types of exercises.

Event and festival celebration

All major festivals are celebrated with great pomp by the children and the staff of Bal Sahyog.





Bal Sahyog Children Home



A place where children can grow with love, care, and protection of House Parents, they are nurtured with healthy and nutritious food, their medical needs are attended, they learn and play with friends, and are motivated to lead a responsible, independent, and happy life in future...

The children are always under the care of a team that includes the Superintendent, four House Parents, one Non-Formal Educator/Remedial Educator, one staff nurse, one Social Welfare Officer, one Child Welfare Officer, two Counsellors, five Cooking Staff, four Cleaning Staff, and five Security Guards. All activities are monitored very minutely and decisions are always made for the upliftment and betterment of children. Also, it is taken care of that the demand of the children's committee is fulfilled if worthwhile and possible.

There were a total of 136 boys who lived in the Children Home this year. While some of them were restored to their families, a few were transferred to various other shelter homes based on their needs. Nevertheless, the monthly occupancy in the children's home ranged from a minimum of 91 boys to a maximum of 101 boys at a time.



Bal Sahyog Open Shelter



As per the Department of Women & Child Development, Government of India, the main immediate objective of the Open Shelter remains to look after runaway children, missing children, trafficked children, children suffering from child labour, children in a street situation, child beggars, child substance abusers, children affected by any natural disaster, children living in unauthorised areas/slums, and other vulnerable groups of children for the short term, based on the need assessment of the district. In the future, these children are aimed to be weaned away from street life and be enabled to lead a dignified and productive life. Care, support, rehabilitation, and holistic development, being the cornerstones of all activities, all children in the open shelter are provided with a conducive and positive environment that instils them with hope for a better life.

This year there were 112 new children, who joined the Open Shelter at different times for their short stays, with a maximum of 24 staying in Bal Sahyog at a time.

Art & Craft Activities



At Bal Sahyog, Art & craft activities are promoted for their multiple benefits. It enhances eye-hand coordination and improves the fine motor skills that are necessary for writing and dexterity. It also helps them with the expression of their suppressed emotions and releases stress. They are able to communicate their ideas and show creativity through them. Such activities have proven to be immensely beneficial for our kids. Therefore we promote these activities at Open Shelter for their preparation for future learning platforms. This is one of the favorite activities of children as well. They often use their creations to decorate the premises too.

Non Formal Education

Most children joining the Open Shelter have no previous exposure to education. They are therefore gradually integrated into the educational system after their initial assessment, with initial admittance to the NFE class. The open shelter is intended for a short period of transition before the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) makes a final decision on their future accommodation. Therefore, NFE remains the most suitable place for initiation of the elementary form of education with them. A bridge educator is available to assist students in learning and preparing for formal education by using a comprehensive course curriculum and teaching techniques..



Morning Assembly

Morning assembly helps children to set the tone for the rest of the day and gives them a right start. Children begin their day by seeking the blessings of the almighty through the Morning Prayer. We have observed that boys exhibit their best behaviour and attitude when they participate in the assembly and prayer. It contributes to their composure and mental & spiritual well-being too, and they are more receptive and disciplined thereafter.



Education

At Bal Sahyog, the staff copes with the children in such a way that a peaceful and conjunctive study environment is maintained. At Bal Sahyog, 93 boys attended various schools. Four schools where boys from Bal Sahyog studied are Nagar Nigam Prathamik Sahsikha Vidyalaya Raj Avenue for primary schooling, Bal Sahyog Middle School, Government Boys Senior Secondary School, Mata Sundari, New Delhi, and National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS). Consistent efforts have been made to give quality education to the children, and for the same, we have also received help from "Tech Mahindra Foundation" and "Make a Difference".

Middle School

Since 1987, Bal Sahyog has been providing quality education to children from class VI to VIII in the age group of 10 to 14 years within its campus. The Directorate of Education, Government of NCT of Delhi, has recognised the school and provides financial assistance. Preference is given to admitting those children who are living in the Children Home/Open Shelter and the immediate neighborhood. A total of 87 children were enrolled in the Middle School during 2022-2023, of which 43 were from Bal Sahyog children Home/Open Shelter and the rest were day scholars from the immediate neighborhood. The school runs from 7:30 am to 1:30 pm and has the facilities of Interactive Teaching and Learning, Smart Boards, Science Laboratory, Computer Centre, and Library.



Classes Sponsored by Tech Mahindra Foundation

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Special tuition assistance classes in subjects including Hindi, English, mathematics, science, physics, chemistry, biology, and economics were offered to children from the children's home.

Additionally, a vocational training program is held at Bal Sahyog and a few other locations to teach computer fundamentals to children in the neighborhood.

The Tech Mahindra Foundation provided funding for both initiatives.

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Tuition Program for Destitute Children

Owing to the background of the majority of the students, whose education is frequently ignored owing to poverty and other financial and social circumstances, They typically had a very limited educational background before they came to Bal Sahyog, and as a result, classes at school are insufficient for the children of Bal Sahyog. The Tech Mahindra Foundation and we work hard to reinforce their fundamentals and provide them with the necessary skills so that they can perform well in their individual schools' academic exams.

Tech Mahindra Foundation has been playing a key role in providing good education to the children of Bal Sahyog via its Tuition sponsorship program. Last year total of 104 children were engaged into this program. Children scoring good result were rewarded in various ways throughout the session and during the end of the session.

Reward Distribution



On 23rd June 2022 reward distribution ceremony was held. Chandan of class XIIth scored 83% marks in the board exam. Mobile Tablet sponsored by Tech Mahindra Foundation and scholarship of Rs. 500 on behalf of reward from Bal Sahyog was distributed among the children, who scored more than 75 percent marks. The scholarship of Rs 500/- was provided to the children every month in the academic year.

Drawing competition



On 24th September 2022 Drawing competition was organized under project being sponsored by 'tech Mahindra Foundation'. All the children of Bal Sahyog took part in the competition and tried to show their excellence in fine arts. Taking care of levels of the kids, the children were divided into three groups and in each group children were declared 1st, 2nd and 3rd position.

Vocational training Program by Tech Mahindra Foundation



Bal Sahyog is currently running the Computer Training Programme to help youth, men and women learn basic computer skills at the contact centres in different locations of Delhi, namely at Karol Bagh, Wazirpur, and Connaught Place. This year, 300 youth got trained in the basic computer course, which is a huge achievement for both them and us. This is one of the most sought-after courses amongst youth, and both females and males join this course in nearly equal strength. This year, 172 female students pursued this course, while the male students numbered 128.

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CHILDREN TO THE NEARBY SCHOOLS

There were 34 children enrolled for studies in Mata Sundari Govt. Boys Senior Secondary School in classes IX to XII from Bal Sahyog Children Home. All the children were retained in the said school throughout the academic session. The children were provided with personal coaching by our tutors.



MINISTRY OF MICRO, SMALL & MEDIUM ENTERPRISES (MSME)

MSME, Development Institute, Extension Centre was established in the year 1956 to provide technical training for skill development in different trades to the educated, unemployed youth and school dropout children of the Society. In the year 2022-23 total of 43 children from Bal Sahyog attended vocational courses like cutting and tailoring and carpentry at MSME. The aim of this training at MSME is to generate self-employment and to provide skilled personnel to the industrial sector.

Support from Make A Difference

Make a Difference is a Non Government Organization (NGO) that advocates for young people that require care and security. In order to provide the children of Bal Sahyog with the necessary fundamental education during the academic periods, MAD has actively been involved in supporting children by providing them tuition classes on the holidays. They also help our children after they turn 18 years old, which is exceptionally kind of them. In the last one year they covered four children from Bal Sahyog into the After care program by Make A Difference.

During the last 5 years (2018-2022), MAD covered 31 youths into their After Care Program, out of which 10 youths are now employed, eleven are engaged into some educational based program, and remaining 10 are either restored or in search of some job.

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Recreational Facilities

Bal Sahyog believes that participation in sports and cultural pursuits is essential to the development of a person's personality and moral fiber. We have a large playground with designated areas for basketball, badminton, cricket, football, and volleyball. Children have many of opportunities to practice their talents inside the building. Additionally, Bal Sahyog students have competed in sports including race, high jump, long jump, and kabaddi, winning prizes in each.

Children are also given resources to practice indoor activities like chess, Ludo, Snake & Ladder, dancing, yoga, etc. in addition to outdoor games. In addition to participating in sports, boys also love listening to music and watching television. They congregate in the dining hall to watch their favorite movies, television shows, cartoons, and sporting events.

Yoga Classes

Yoga is a holistic way of uplifting the overall health of individuals, and the importance of yoga for children is highly emphasised by health practitioners and educationists alike. Therefore, yoga is a routine health practise for our children in Bal Sahyog. They are guided to assume correct yoga postures with precise techniques to draw the maximum benefits. Children also enjoy them very much and participate in these sessions with full enthusiasm.





Medical

Many of the children who enroll in Bal Sahyog have a history of both acute and chronic medical issues that developed as a result of poor diet, hygiene, and other vulnerable situations they had to deal with in the past. As a result, receiving medical care is a crucial part of their rehabilitation. The moment a child enters Bal Sahyog, a medical examination is done, and suitable action is then taken. Following is a summary of the children seen by various healthcare professionals this year:





Deepu, Class VIII

Health Camps

We are aware of the difficulties that those without access to basic healthcare face.

Therefore we organize and welcome free multispecialty health camps from all over the world. These camps involve a comprehensive medical examination by a doctor, the delivery of free medications, as well as specialized tests. Early diagnosis and treatment are provided by these effective measures, which lower the incidence of morbidity. These health clinics cater to the immediate medical requirements of Bal Sahyog's underprivileged children.

Covid Vaccination camp by Lady Hardinge Hospital.

A Covid vaccination camp was set up by Lady Hardinge Hospital on April 6 and May 27, 2022. Vaccinations were given to 33 kids on April 6 and 27 kids on May 24. All eligible children from Open Shelter and Children Home received vaccines.



Eye Checkup Camp

On June 4, 2022, Dr. Shroff's Charity Eye Hospital in New Delhi hosted an eye checkup camp within the Bal Sahyog campus. During the campaign for general eye checkups, all the kids and employees were covered. The hospital also provides those who need them with eyeglasses.



Blood Checkup Camp



A hemoglobin-blood checkup camp was held on June 16, 2022, at Bal Sahyog by the General Williams Masonic Polyclinic within the campus of Bal Sahyog. Throughout the campaign, tests were administered to every youngster. The physicians also recommended necessary medications for the kids.

Dental checkup camp By Lady Hardinge Hospital

Bal Sahyog and Lady Hardinge Hospital collaborated to hold a dental checkup camp on August 7. All of the children living at the Bal Sahyog children's home and open shelter were included in the campaign, and necessary steps were also taken to enhance the dental health of the children who were found to have any kind of dental disease or illness.





Food and Dining

Providing healthy, fresh, balanced, and nutritious meals every day is a non-compromising aspect of Bal Sahyog's approach to children's health. Seasonal vegetables, pulses, fruits, milk, eggs, curd, and salad with roti and rice are served daily to all the boys. Snacks and refreshments are also made available every evening. Children can eat as per their appetite, and as much as they wish. In addition to the food, they also take a spoonful of chawanprash every night to boost their immunity.

Bal Sahyog has a well-equipped modular kitchen with a multipurpose gas oven, a modular chimney, a large storage system, fridges, flour kneading machines, wet grinding machines, and a chapati-making machine to provide safe and hygienic food to the children, so that all the children could dine together. We have a large dining hall with 28 five-seater benches, sufficient enough for all the children to take their food comfortably.

Special Meals



Children of Bal Sahyog love to have delicious meals on the day of occasion or festivals. It is due to our kind contributors who help our children mark important dates and occasions and support us by sponsoring meals with cash or in-kind donations to make it possible for us to accommodate it each time on special occasion. They accomplish this by getting some snacks made in our kitchen or by having the families of the sponsors send them, which the children love. Halwa, kheer, sewinyan, paneer dishes, rayata, and dal makhni are just a few of the mouthwatering foods on the special lunch menu that are offered. Over the course of the past year, 143 special meals, including breakfast, lunch, and dinner, have been donated.





Sports and Competitions

Sports are more than just sports, amusement, and fun. We should consider it a key to improving children's physical, mental, and organizational health as well as developing strong leadership qualities in them.

Fighting to win in competitions requires teamwork, focus, coordination, and creativity, which are the keys to success. Every child must have these skills; therefore, we encourage children to participate in competitions.

This year, a total of five sports and a zonal-level slogan and drawing competition occurred.

Cricket match at Bal Sahyog

Children who play outside have stronger muscles and bones, boost their immunity, and reduce their risk of developing major illnesses. Bal Sahyog continues to organise outdoor activities for the kids while keeping in mind their fitness. A cricket match was played on June 26, 2022, between the kids from Bal Sahyog. After the match, gifts were given out to the kids to cheer them on.

1st prize in cricket Match

On September 11, 2022, and September 18, 2022, children from Bal Sahyog attended a cricket match hosted by Aadhya Foundation. Our children won both the matches and bagged first prize. In the tournament of two matches Child Lala became man of the match by taking 7 wickets in the first match. Whereas in the second match Child Gaurav scored 64 runs and became man of the match.



Slogan and Drawing Competition



In competition organized by the Government Boys Senior Secondary School, Child Rohit of class XII won first prize in Slogan writing competition at zonal level whereas 2nd price in district level. Also child Vishal bagged 2nd price in the zonal level painting competition. Congratulation to both the children.....

Zonal tournaments by Directorate of Education (DOE)

Zonal hand ball tournament was held on 22-09-2022 by Directorate Of Education (DOE), National Capital Territory (NCT), Delhi. Middle school children from class 6th to 8th joined the competition and bagged 3rd Price.

Bal Sahyog's children excel in a variety of sports, they proved it by their efforts and dedication throughout the zonal competition.

Again the Directorate of Education, Government of NCT, New Delhi, held a zonal sports tournament on August 3, 2022, and the students of Bal Sahyog Middle School participated in it. Bal Sahyog's children received prizes and trophies for placing third in handball and second in kabaddi, respectively. On February 10th, 2023, the representatives from the Directorate of Education department gave out the prizes.



Sports Day campaign By Nehru Yuva Kendra



Nehru Yuva Kendra was founded in the year 1972, with the aim of giving youth opportunities to participate in nation-building efforts as well as opportunities for the development of their personalities and skills. Many different types of games were organised by Nehru Yuva Kendra at Bal Sahyog on 24th December 2022. The children participated in those games with full enthusiasm. Several children showed exceptional performance and bagged various prizes, and trophies.

Sports event by Magic Bus

Magic Bus works with children and young people in India taking them on a journey from childhood to livelihood and out of poverty.

Representatives from the company Magic Bus organized a sporting event for the children of Bal Sahyog on March 29, 2023. Children from Bal Sahyog and the Magic Bus crew participated in the match and had fun playing games together throughout the day.

Awareness Sessions

In order to increase sensitivity and knowledge about the various challenges among the people throughout the globe, Bal Sahyog conducts awareness and fundamental skill building sessions with a variety of national and international stakeholder groups, including teachers, college students, NGO professionals, police officials, medical experts, etc.

This year eight such awareness camps and sessions were organized.

Animal welfare workshop by Straw India

At Bal Sahyog, Straw India conducted a program to instill a sense of compassion for animals in young people. Students engaged in a range of activities for this, including as creating animal houses, recognizing issues with animals, and creating stories. Documentaries with an animal subject were also shown to the children. From May 27 to June 1 to and June 3, 2022, the camp was organized.



World Yoga Day

Moraji Desai National Institute of Yoga, organised a yoga practice session for the children of Bal Sahyog. The session was organised every morning from May 21 through June 21, 2022. Tree Plantation Drive



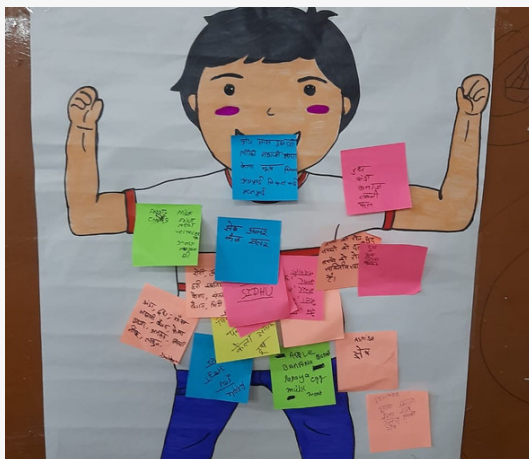

Children from Delhi Public School, Noida and Students From Germany, on an exchange program visit at Bal Sahyog

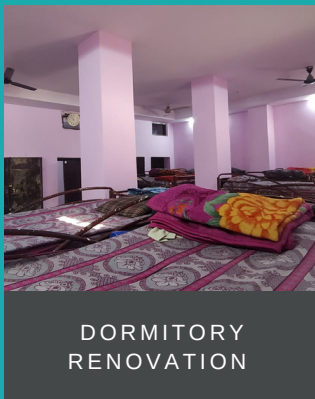

Success Stories



Piyush

Piyush is a native of West Bengal. On September 25, 2023, as directed by the CWC, the child was approached from the Kapasheda police station to the open shelter, Bal Sahyog. According to a report on children with physical disabilities from Pt. Deen Dayal National Institute, Piyush was mentally and physically handicapped and had an IQ of less than twenty. Through persistent work with the several police stations, we were able to track down the missing child's FIR, which was filed by a housemaid staying at Dwarka. After communication, we could identify that the lady was the mother who lost the child in a road accident. The father of the child passed away three years ago. We handed over the child to the mother once we were assured that the mother was willing and capable of taking care of the child.



Kartik

"Where there is will there is a way". Kartik proved this true. When he was 20 years old, his father passed suddenly, and his mother and three elder brothers encouraged him to continue attending college so he might advance in life. Kartik entered Bal Sahyog in April 2019 in order to complete his computer applications vocational training. After finishing the course, Kartik took the prudent and wise choice to work in addition to his studies at parallel in order to earn a small income and make his financial contribution and support his family.

Kartik is currently employed as Executive Administration at Loveinstore Technologies Pvt Ltd and is paid a monthly salary of Rs 24,000/-.



Laxman

Laxman was bought up by his Mother in an extreme poor financial environment. Through Child Welfare Committee, Laxman came to Bal Sahyog few years back, and was given all the basic rights including Education, Food, Shelter, Clothing and Affection. Due to his interest in Studies he was supported by our generous donors, Mr. Kunal Sumani and Ms. Anjali Makhija from November 2017 to January 2018 with a scholarship of Rs 5000/- per month. In 2018, the child completed his 18 years and got excellent marks in class X board exams. Laxman left Bal Sahyog in 2018 with a good academic record of 84%. Laxman completed his graduation from Satyawati collage of Delhi University. Now he is working and is earning and adding financial support to his Family.

Success Stories



Himanshu

Himanshu began working with Bal Sahyog in 2015. Himanshu's outstanding performance in class 12th was made possible by the combined efforts of Bal Sahyog, Himanshu, and the child's exercise regimen. Himanshu chose to enroll in Delhi University's regular collage after receiving a 92% in his class 12 exam. As a result, he received assistance in applying to Delhi University, where he was accepted to Ramjas College. He decided to pursue a Bachelor of Arts with Honors in Political Science. For additional aftercare support, Bal Sahyog also connected him to Make A Difference (MAD). He received 7.1 CGPA in the undergraduate exam. Himanshu decided to pursue a career in graphic design since he had a strong interest in the field. Consequently, he is currently doing internship as Graphic Designer in MCD.



Chandan

The case file states that his mother, who resides in her village in Bihar, is suffering from a psychological issue, and that his father, who is disabled, lives someplace along the side of the road in Delhi. Along with his younger brother, Chandan arrived in Bal Sahyog Children's Home on April, 2018, and he was restored on October, 2022, when he turned 18 years old.

He finished his education during this time, determined to get good grades. Due to his consistent good performance, he was awarded a scholarship each year, where the management of Bal Sahyog presented him a monthly reward of Rs. 500. Chandan was able to get into regular courses at Delhi University after he successfully passed the NEET exam with a high score.



Srawan

Srawan stayed in Bal Sahyog Home for long time, till the age of 18. Shrawan completed graduation in Geography (Honors) from Saheed Bhagat Singh Collage, Delhi University with a CGPA of 7.5. He is intelligent as well as hard working boy. Shrawan, during graduation also worked part time at Bal Sahyog, as an Asst. to Computer Instructor. During the final year of graduation he also received support from Make a Difference. He is currently receiving a stipend as part of the Gandhi Fellowship program, and this support has enabled him to achieve complete independence.
