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## ABOUT BAL SAHYOG

ESTABLISHED IN 1954

Bal Sahyog was founded as a pious endeavor by the late Prime Minister of India, Smt. Indira Gandhi in 1954 for Care and Protection of the helpless, orphan, abandoned, runaways and vulnerable children and the children rescued from child labour. Bal Sahyog provides round-the-clock services of shelter, nutrition, medical care, clothing, education, vocational training, recreational and overall amenities to more than 125 children within its Children's Home. The Hon'ble Prime Minister of India is the Patron of Bal Sahyog.

In its endeavor to the holistic development of children in need and collective action, Bal Sahyog has been networking and collaborating with different Child Care Institutions, Government Institutions, Law Enforcement Agencies, Donor Agencies, Non-Government Organizations, Civil Society Organizations, Opinion Makers, and individuals for the same. It is located in the area of 1.67 acres in Connaught Place, New Delhi. It has also established a Bal Sahyog Middle School within its campus that is aided by Govt. of NCT of Delhi.

The Organization has a well-defined financial policy, Child Protection Policy, HR Policy, and its accounts are audited by a reputed audit firm. Bal Sahyog works only in the NCT of Delhi.

## VISION

To actualize the birthright of every child to a safe and secure childhood so that s/he can develop the intellectual, practical, and spiritual capabilities to live a meaningful adult life and contribute to nation-building.

## MISSION

To provide opportunities that help economically and socially marginalized children to develop their full potential in an atmosphere of love, understanding, and joyful learning.

## GOVERNANCE

Bal Sahyog is governed by a General Committee of 25–30 members nominated by the Prime Minister's Office. These members are eminent people from different fields including current and retired bureaucrats, academicians, and social workers.

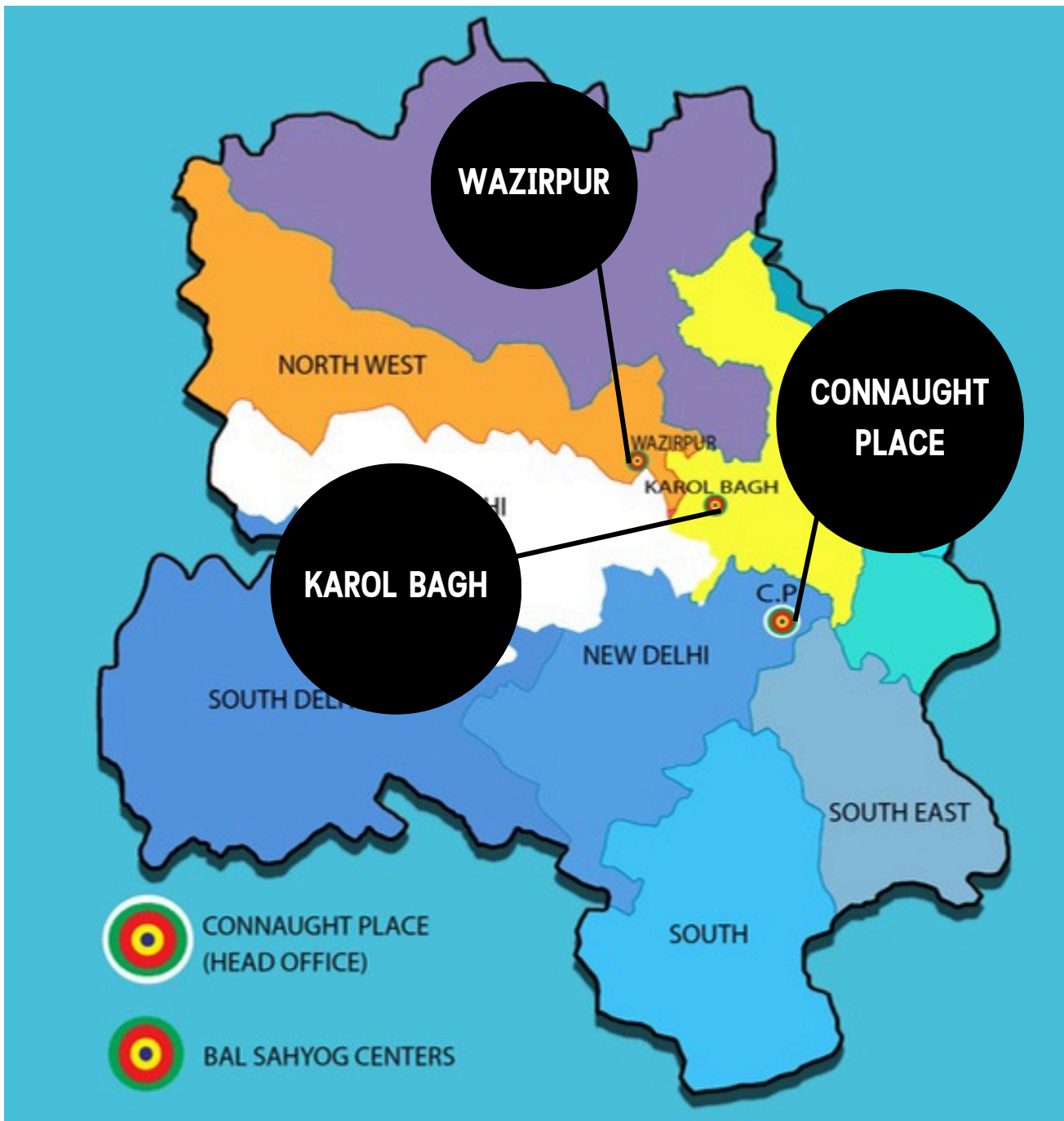
Mrs. Reva Nayyar, retired IAS (Former Secretary to the Ministry of Women & Child Development, Government of India), is the Chairperson of the General Committee. The General Committee, being the governing body, decides the overall policy of the organization. For day to day function and implementing the policies of the General Committee, an Executive Committee is constituted. The Executive Committee is headed by the Chairperson of the General Committee. It has four members elected/selected by the General Committee and an Executive Director who also acts as the Ex-officio Member-Secretary of the General Committee and the Executive Committee.

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Bal Sahyog is financially supported by grants from the Government of the National Capital Territory (NCT) of Delhi, the Tech Mahindra Foundation, as well as several individuals and corporate donors, to support various welfare activities for underprivileged children, women, and youth. Besides, several individuals, groups, institutions, and NGOs donate materials in kind like play materials, dresses, shoes, rations, etc. for children, and also participate in fun activities, creative programmes, and celebrate important occasions and sponsor lunches and dinners for children. Some patrons sponsor exposure visits for children to historical places, gardens, and parks in Delhi.







## WHERE WE ARE

The Children's Home is located in Central Delhi (which also houses its head office) at Connaught Place, and its outreach programmes are organised in Central Delhi, including the areas of New Delhi Railway Station, Bengali Market, Hanuman Mandir, Paharganj, Shankar Market, and Bangla Sahib Gurudwara, etc. It has been making constant efforts to strengthen its institutional approach to reach out to the community so that prevention and sustainable assistance for the growth and development of children can be provided through community awareness. Last year, Bal Sahyog had community development points (community contact centres) located in different slums of Delhi, such as Wazirpur in North-West Delhi, Karol Bagh, and Connaught Place in Central Delhi.

# OUR Achievements



## 301 Stayed

248 boys stayed at Bal Sahyog, among which 162 were in the Open Shelter.



## 363 Trained

363 youths were vocationally trained in computer courses. This Vocational training was supported by Tech Mahindra Foundation.



## 179 Restored

75 children from the Children Home and 104 children from Open Shelter were either restored to their families or transferred to other institutions.



## 102 Tuition

104 children from class 1 to class 12 were supported for quality education under the Scholarship Programme of the 'Tech Mahindra Foundation'.

# BAL SAHYOG CHILDREN HOME

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**BAL SAHYOG CHILDREN HOME IS FOR CHILDREN BETWEEN THE AGE GROUP OF 5 TO 18, FOR THEIR LONG-TERM STAY.**

A place where children can grow with love, care, and protection of House Parents, they are nurtured with healthy and nutritious food, their medical needs are attended, they learn and play with friends, and are motivated to lead a responsible, independent, and happy life in future...

The children are always under the care of a team that includes the Superintendent, four House Parents, one Non-Formal Educator/Remedial Educator, one staff nurse, one Social Welfare Officer, one Child Welfare Officer, two Counsellors, five Cooking Staff, four Cleaning Staff, and five Security Guards.

All activities are monitored very minutely and decisions are always made for the upliftment and betterment of children. Also, it is taken care of that the demand of the children's committee is fulfilled if worthwhile and possible.

There were a total of 136 boys who lived in the Children Home this year. While some of them were restored to their families, a few were transferred to various other shelter homes based on their needs. Nevertheless, the monthly occupancy in the children's home ranged from a minimum of 91 boys to a maximum of 101 boys at a time.





# BAL SAHYOG OPEN SHELTER

As per the Department of Women & Child Development, Government of India, the main immediate objective of the Open Shelter remains to look after runaway children, missing children, trafficked children, children suffering from child labour, children in a street situation, child beggars, child substance abusers, children affected by any natural disaster, children living in unauthorised areas/slums, and other vulnerable groups of children for the short term, based on the need assessment of the district.

In the future, these children are aimed to be weaned away from street life and be enabled to lead a dignified and productive life. Care, support, rehabilitation, and holistic development being the cornerstones of all activities, all children in the open shelter are provided with a conducive and positive environment that instills them with hope for a better life. This year there were 112 new children who joined the Open Shelter at different times for their short stays, with a maximum of 24 staying in Bal Sahyog at a time.



# DAY TO DAY ACTIVITIES



## MORNING ASSEMBLY

Morning assembly helps children to set the tone for the rest of the day and gives them a right start. Children begin their day by seeking the blessings of the almighty through the Morning Prayer. We have observed that boys exhibit their best behaviour and attitude when they participate in the assembly and prayer. It contributes to their composure and mental & spiritual well-being too, and they are more receptive and disciplined thereafter.



## HOUSE MEETING

At Bal Sahyog, House meeting is organized every week on Saturday so that children could express their emotions and discuss problems they are facing. The discussion is held in presence of all the staff members directly related with the care & protection and development activities of the children. The solution to the problems are strictly committed and hence resolved. In addition to resolution to the problems, fresh concepts are also presented to up-bring the children in best possible ways.



# YOGA CLASSES

Yoga is a holistic way of uplifting the overall health of individuals, and the importance of yoga for children is highly emphasised by health practitioners and educationists alike. Therefore, yoga is a routine health practise for our children in Bal Sahyog. They are guided to assume correct yoga postures with precise techniques to draw the maximum benefits. Children also enjoy them very much and participate in these sessions with full enthusiasm.



# Birthday Celebration

A birthday celebration is the best way to gift a child a bit of happiness and joy. The celebration makes them feel loved and they do make some good memories too. On the 3rd of every month birthday of all the children having birthdays in the same month is celebrated in Bal Sahyog.



Overall, 12 birthdays were celebrated during the year April 2023 - March 2024 at Bal Sahyog. On all the birthdays children cut the cake and received gifts.

# Exposure visits

## VISIT TO ZOOLOGICAL PARK

Children from Bal Sahyog were invited to visit the National Zoological Park, Mathura Road, New Delhi on June 4, 2023. Children were very appreciative of the park administration for setting up such a visit for them where they could enjoy themselves and learn a great deal about the wild animals.

## SESSION ON NUTRITION BY NIPCCD.

## SESSION ON HEALTH AND HYGINE FROM STUDENTS FROM LADY HARDINGE COLLEGE



Students from Lady Hardinge College conducted hygiene lessons with 22 Bal Sahyog children on May 6, 2023. With the help of ten steps, role playing, and demonstrations, they taught all of the children how to wash their hands before and after taking meal.

Children were distributed antiseptic soap in the end of this session.

## SESSION ON HEALTH AND HYGINE MS. GEETANJALI

Ms. Geetanjali led a class on "health hygiene" on October 31, 2023. The goal of the session was to teach the children of Bal Sahyog the value of cleanliness and good health.

A short quiz was also conducted, and children who scored 1st, 2nd, and 3rd were rewarded with gifts. All the children of Bal Sahyog were also given snacks and sweets after the quiz ended.

# Medical & Health Camps

## MEDICAL AND HEALTH SESSIONS



### Session on first aid

For the children of Bal Sahyog, a dental cleanliness camp was conducted on May 4th, 2023 by the Rotary Club of Delhi Midtown, RI District 3011.

Children were also taught the importance of brushing their teeth thoroughly every day.

On 07th of February, 2024 Lady Hardinge Medical College Organized Dental & Oral Check-up Camp for All children & All staff of Bal Sahyog .



**Dental health hygiene camp by Dr. Surbhi**

On August 12, children from Bal Sahyog joined the session on dental health hygiene by Dr. Surabhi (a dental surgeon) at Bharti Vidyapati University, Pune. The doctor explained the importance of oral hygiene and also explained how diseases grow stronger if we do not value oral health.



## HEMOGLOBIN AND EYE CHECKUP CAMPS



### Hemoglobin test campaign

Bal Sahyog and General Williams Masonic Polyclinic collaborated on a blood hemoglobin test campaign on August 5, 2023 to assess each child's general health. All of the children underwent testing, and everyone felt satisfied with their favorable outcome.

With the help of our kind supporters, corporations, and companies, Bal Sahyog continues to hold numerous health camps in an effort to raise awareness and keep children in good health. Dr. Shroff's Charity Eye Hospital, Daryaganj, were invited to hold an eye camp at Bal Sahyog on November 18, 2023. Along with taking part in the campaign, children and employees had their eyes examined by the hospital's highly skilled and knowledgeable Doctors.

# EDUCATION

The team at Bal Sahyog engages with children in a way that preserves a calm and harmonious learning atmosphere. 87 boys attended different schools at Bal Sahyog. The boys from Bal Sahyog attended three different schools: Government Boys Senior Secondary School, Mata Sundari Road, New Delhi; Bal Sahyog Middle School; and Nagar Nigam Vidyalaya. We have been working hard to provide the children with a high-quality education, and "Tech Mahindra Foundation" and "Make a Difference" have provided support in this regard.

## Middle School

Since 1987, Bal Sahyog has been providing quality education to children from class VI to VIII in the age group of 10 to 14 years within its campus. The Directorate of Education, Government of NCT of Delhi, has recognised the school and provides financial assistance. Preference is given to admitting those children who are living in the Children Home/Open Shelter and the immediate neighborhood. A total of 69 children were enrolled in the Middle School during 2023-2024, of which 43 were from Bal Sahyog children Home/Open Shelter and the rest were day scholars from the immediate neighborhood. The school runs from 7:30 am to 1:30 pm and has the facilities of Interactive Teaching and Learning, Smart Boards, Science Laboratory, Computer Centre, and Library.



## Tuition Classes Sponsored by Tech Mahindra Foundation

Children from the children's home were provided special tuition support classes in subjects like Hindi, English, Mathematics, Science, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Economics, and Accountancy. This programme was funded by the Tech Mahindra Foundation. Under this, by arranging eight tutors more than 100 boys from Bal Sahyog studying in class II to class XII attended tuition classes throughout the year.



## Children to the nearby schools

There were 27 children enrolled for studies in Mata Sundari Govt. Boys Senior Secondary School in classes IX to XII from Bal Sahyog Children Home. All the children were retained in the said school throughout the academic session. The children were provided with personal coaching by our tutors.



## Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises (MSME)

MSME, Development Institute, Extension Centre was established in the year 1956 to provide technical training for skill development in different trades to the educated, unemployed youth and school dropout children of the Society.

In the year 2023-24 total of 25 children from Bal Sahyog attended vocational courses like cutting and tailoring and carpentry at MSME. The aim of this training at MSME is to generate self-employment and to provide skilled personnel to the industrial sector.

## Special classes Sponsored by 'Make a Difference' (MAD)

the organization Make a Difference has been making continuous efforts to provide support to all the needy children in different societies throughout the country. During the year 2023-2024 children at Bal Sahyog attended classes conducted by MAD to clear their concepts in all academic subjects. The classes conducted by MAD catalyzes the knowledge gained by the children from their schools and tuitions.

# Sponsorship Programs by Tech Mahindra Foundation

## Tuition Program for destitute children

Bal Sahyog provided special tuition in English, Mathematics, Science, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Economics, and Accountancy to the Children at Bal Sahyog Home at Connaught Place which is supported by Tech Mahindra Foundation. Total 104 beneficiaries studying in class 1st to 12th were provided tuition classes by 8 tutors, in the last six months. A drawing and painting competition was also been organized by Tech Mahindra Foundation at Bal Sahyog, Connaught Place.

## Computer Literacy Program by Tech Mahindra Foundation

# Kitchen & Dining

Bal Sahyog's attention to the health of children goes beyond meeting their nutritional and medical needs. It also includes the mental, social, and spiritual aspects of the boys' well-being, and concerted efforts are made perpetually to ensure that every child is healthy and happy.

Bal Sahyog has a well-equipped modular kitchen with a multipurpose gas oven, a modular chimney, a large storage system, fridges, flour kneading machines, wet grinding machines, and a chapati-making machine to provide safe and hygienic food to the children, so that all the children could dine together. We have a large dining hall with 28 five-seater benches, sufficient enough for all the children to take their food comfortably.

## Our concern for good nutrition...

Providing healthy, fresh, balanced, and nutritious meals every day is a non-compromising aspect of Bal Sahyog's approach to children's health. Seasonal vegetables, pulses, fruits, milk, eggs, curd, and salad with roti and rice are served daily to all the boys. Snacks and refreshments are also made available every evening. Children can eat as per their appetite, and as much as they wish. In addition to the food, they also take a spoonful of chawanprash every night to boost their immunity.

# SUCCESS STORIES



Chandan

The case file states that his mother, who resides in a village in Bihar state, is suffering from a psychological disorder, and that his father, who is disabled, lives someplace along the side of the road in Delhi. Along with his younger brother, Chandan arrived in Bal Sahyog Children's Home on April, 2018, and he was restored on October, 2022, when he turned 18 years old.

He finished his education during this time, determined to get good grades. Due to his consistent good performance, he was awarded a scholarship each year, where the management of Bal Sahyog presented him a monthly reward of Rs. 500. Chandan was able to get into regular courses at Delhi University after he successfully passed the CUET (Common University Entrance Test) exam with a high score. He's currently juggling a B.Com 3rd year with an accountant internship at a CA firm.



Himanshu

Himanshu Joined Bal Sahyog in 2015. Himanshu's outstanding performance in class 12th was made possible by the combined efforts of Bal Sahyog, Himanshu, and the child's exercise regimen. Himanshu chose to enroll in Delhi University's regular collage after receiving a 92% in his class 12 exam. As a result, he received assistance in applying to Delhi University, where he was accepted to Ramjas College. He decided to pursue a Bachelor of Arts with Honors in Political Science. For additional aftercare support, Bal Sahyog also connected him to Make A Difference (MAD). He received 7.1 CGPA in the undergraduate exam. Himanshu decided to pursue a career in graphic design due to his strong interest in the field. Consequently, he completed his internship as Graphic Designer in MCD and is currently employed at 'Adda 247' and receives a salary of Rs. 25000/- per month.





Laxman

Laxman was brought-up by his Mother in an extreme poor financial environment. Through Child Welfare Committee, (CWC) Laxman came to Bal Sahyog few years back, and was given all the basic rights including Education, Food, Shelter, Clothing and Affection. Due to his interest in Studies he was supported by our generous donors, Mr. Kunal Sumani and Ms. Anjali Makhija from November 2017 to January 2018 with a scholarship of Rs 5000/- per month. In 2018, the child completed his 18 years and got excellent marks in class X board exams. Laxman left Bal Sahyog in 2018 with a good academic record of 84%. Laxman completed his graduation from Satyawati collage of Delhi University. Now he is working working in RBL Bank as a subject matter expert (SME) and is earning and adding financial support to his Family.



Jai

Jai was enrolled at Bal Sahyog in April 2019 when he heard about the computer vocational education offered by the organization from a close friend. Jai was admitted to a computer applications vocational training course, where he performed well and was able to score grade 'A'. After finishing the course, he made the prudent and wise choice to work in addition to his studies in parallel in order to earn a small income, make his financial contribution, and support his family.

Jai currently works for a company as a backend sales associate and receives a salary of Rs 24,000/- per month.



Srawan

Srawan stayed in Bal Sahyog Home for long time, till the age of 18. Shrawan completed graduation in Geography (Honors) from Saheed Bhagat Singh Collage, Delhi University with a CGPA of 7.5. He is intelligent as well as hard working boy. Shrawan, during graduation also worked part time at Bal Sahyog, as an Asst. to Computer Instructor. During the final year of graduation he also received support from Make a Difference. He is currently receiving a scholarship under the Gandhi Fellowship Programme, and is also pursuing MARD from IGNOU.



Shehar

At the New Delhi Railway Station, Shehar Ali was found abandoned. It was somewhat tough for us to trace his relatives because this child was illiterate and also was dumb. Since the boy was mute he was unable to provide us with any information about where he lived or his family. Despite our best efforts, which included placing advertisements in newspaper articles, Doordarshan talks, and on websites like Track the Missing, we were finally able to obtain the child's Adhaar card, which allowed us to find his address and return him to his family in accordance with the CWC-IX order on January 12, 2024.



Gulfam

Gulfam had a poor mental IQ. At the New Delhi Railway Station, outreach workers from an organization spotted the child abandoned. On November 30, 2022, this child was admitted to Bal Sahyog. The Institute of Human Behavior and Allied Sciences (IHBAS) evaluated his IQ due to his mental handicap; he received a score of 60% on the exam, indicating poor mental health. Because of this, the child was unable to communicate verbally and was unable to convey or explain anything about the family.

We made multiple attempts to locate the family, and eventually we were able to determine the child's place of origin and family location. On August 24, 2023, CWC-IX issued an order allowing us to return the child to his family.



Suresh

Suresh was brought to Bal Shyog on December 08, 2023, as per the directive of CWC-V Sankar Ashram. The boy was mentally weak and receiving therapy for his medical condition at GB Pant Hospital when he was transferred.

Many attempts were made to locate his family. The boy used to say the only word Assam whenever we tried to talk to him regarding his address. We also sought assistance from Child Line, Assam, in our efforts to locate his family in Assam. The attempt yielded no positive outcome. After some research, it was discovered that the child was from the Nepalese district of Achham.

With the support of the Chora Chori Nepal Organization, we were able to pinpoint the exact address where the child belonged from. Additionally, we learned that the child's parents are in Pune, Maharashtra, even though the rest of the family lived in Achham.

on March 6, 2024, as per the directive of CWC-V, Third Battalion assisted us in escorting the youngster to CWC Pune .The child was restored by them to the parents.

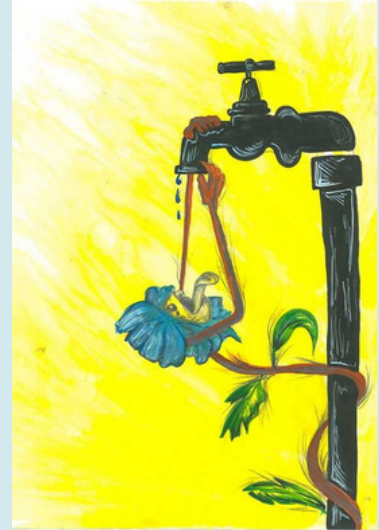
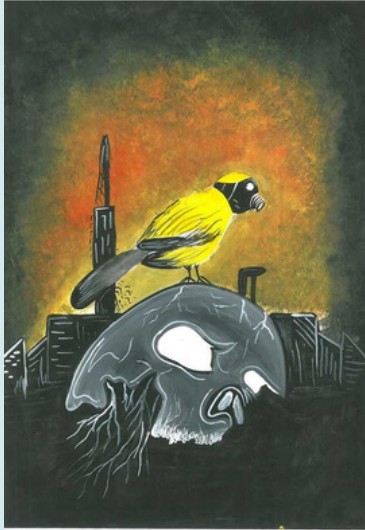
