Bal Sahyog provides round the clock services of shelter, nutrition, medical care, clothing, education, vocational training, recreational and over all amenities to more than 125 children within its Children's Home. Honorable Prime Minister of India is the Patron of Bal Sahyog.

In its endeavor to holistic development of children in need and collective action, Bal Sahyog has been networking and collaborating with different child care Institutions, government Institutions, law enforcement agencies, donor agencies, non-government organizations, civil society organizations, opinion makers and individuals for the same. It is located in a campus of 1.67 acres in Connaught Place, New Delhi.

Key Highlights

In the last six months total of 34 children from Open Shelter and 03 from Shelter home were restored and rehabilitated.

Bal Sahyog Children's Home has covered 185 children in need of care and protection including Open Shelter and Shelter home. We have provided shelter, nutrition, education, health care, counseling, vocational training, computer skills and recreational facilities.

Covered More than 300 children under computer literacy Program and more than 100 children under tuition sponsorship program by ESSEL foundation.

Children Home

Bal Sahyog operates two Children's Homes—BSCH-1 and BSCH-2—each licensed for 50 children (ages 6–11 and 12–18 respectively), along with an Open Shelter for 25 children. It also runs a middle school (classes VI–VIII) for residents and nearby children. The Connaught Place campus includes an eight-bed dispensary, a modular kitchen, a large dining hall, and ample space for recreation and sports.



Bal Sahyog Children Home (BSCH)-1

During the last 6 months 37 children stayed at Bal Sahyog Children Home (BSCH)-1, out of which 2 children were successfully restored to their families as per the order of CWC (Child welfare Committee or after they completed 18 years of age.

Children Home

Bal Sahyog Children Home (BSCH)-2

During the last six months, a total of 42 children resided at Bal Sahyog Children Home (BSCH-2), where they received care, protection, education, and support for their overall development. During this period, one child was successfully restored to his family, and one child was adopted by a family, both in accordance with the orders issued by the Child Welfare Committee (CWC). Additionally, both children transitioned out of the home after attaining the age of 18, taking steps toward their living and reintegration into society.

Open Shelter

During the last 6 months 88 children stayed at Bal Sahyog Open Shelter , out of which 34 children were successfully restored to their families.

The children in need of care and protection are provided with health care, counseling support and opportunity for residential stay for a short time at Bal Sahyog. These children are brought in from the nearby locality and produced before the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) where the first choice is made with the child's best interest as its top priority.

Holi Celebration at Bal Sahyog

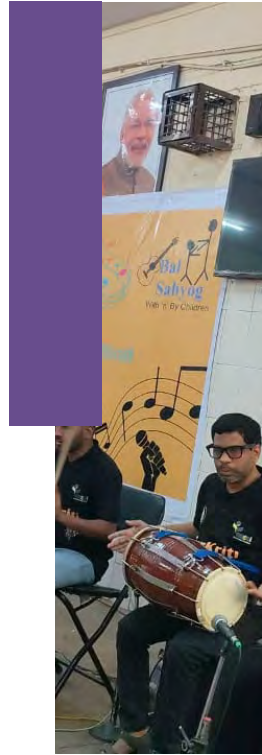
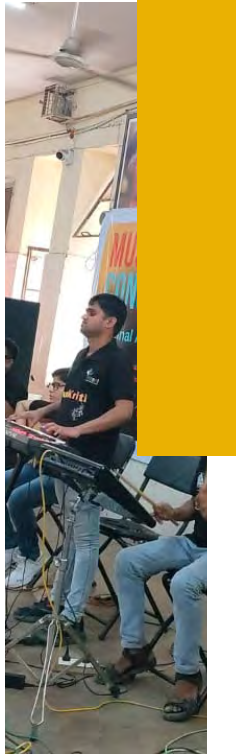

National Association for the Blind, Delhi is a pioneer in initiating services for Individuals with visual impairment and additional disabilities. The organization lays special emphasis on education and skill development and also building a strong partner presence who contribute in sharing views and ideas for helping the visually impaired.

On 1st January 2026, and on 18th March 2026 everyone present at Bal Sahyog became a live volunteer, wholeheartedly engaged in the incredible performances by the music band from the National Association for the Blind (NAB), a remarkable social welfare organization dedicated to empowering individuals with visual impairments.



Our Extension Centre (Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises) MSME

MSME-DI (Development Institute), Extension Centre, Bal Sahyog was established in the year 1956 to provide technical training for skill development in different trades to the educated, unemployed youth and school dropout children of the Society.

The primary objective of these trainings is to encourage self-employment and equip the children with industry-relevant skills, enabling them to become confident and capable contributors to the workforce. Upon successful completion of their courses, the children who enrolled at MSME-DI were also certified, marking an important milestone in their journey toward independence and sustainable livelihoods.



Sponsorship Programs by ESSEL Social Welfare Foundation

Tuition Program for destitute children

Bal Sahyog, with the support of the ESSEL Foundation, has been providing specialized tuition to children at the Bal Sahyog Home in Connaught Place. Over the past six months, more than 100 beneficiaries, ranging from Class 1 to 12, have received tuition in subjects such as English, Mathematics, Science, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Economics, and Accountancy. Six dedicated tutors have been instrumental in supporting these students' academic growth. Along with subject-specific lessons, the children also engage in a variety of classroom activities designed to foster creativity, teamwork, and personal development, enhancing their overall learning experience and helping them build essential life skills.



Computer Literacy Program for Under-Privileged Children

Bal Sahyog is currently running a vocational "Computer Training Programme" with the support of the ESSEL Foundation, aiming to empower adolescents, men, and women by teaching them essential computer skills. This initiative is being carried out at various contact centres across Delhi, specifically in Karol Bagh, Wazirpur, and Connaught Place. In the last six months, more than 150 children have successfully received training in the fundamentals of computers, marking a significant milestone for both the participants and our team. This accomplishment highlights the positive impact of the programme in providing valuable skills that can open doors to further educational and employment opportunities.
